

Fairford Park – Site for Internment of Ashes

Regulations for Memorial

This document is agreed under the obligations set out in the Transfer of land dated

[.....].

1. What is allowed.

- Ground-based memorial slabs made of natural materials only.
- Max width 500mm, max depth 500mm, max height 150mm including any vase for flowers which must be made of the same stone.
- Wreaths and cut flowers may be laid directly on the grave, subject to those persons responsible for the maintenance and upkeep of the burial ground being allowed to remove them when they appear to be withered or dead.
- One suitable toy or tribute may be placed on the grave of a child (i.e. a person under 18 years of age) provided that it is removed after a period of six months.
- Wording must include the name/s of persons buried there and if possible the date of birth and death for information for future historians. All wording and decoration must be approved by the Town Council at the time of application for the erection of the memorial.
- Wreaths and cut flowers may be temporarily placed on graves at the time of burial or for other special anniversaries such as at Christmas or Easter but must be removed when they appear withered.

The Town Council reserves the right to remove any wreaths, cut or artificial flowers placed in the burial ground if they consider them to be unsightly.

2. What is not allowed.

- No ornaments or additions may be placed on other graves save for flowers or wreaths as detailed above.
- Permission will not be granted for any stone with a highly polished or reflective surface.
- Permission will not be granted for photographs or ceramic portraits or any other form of depiction of the person commemorated.
- Permission will not be granted for any other form of memorial, including crosses, kerbs, chippings or sculpture other than temporary wooden crosses
- Permission will not be given for flowers, shrubs, trees to be planted on the grave.
