FAIRFORD REMEMBRANCE SUNDAY PARADE PLAN
9th November 2025

1. **Introduction.** The Fairford Remembrance Sunday Parade is being conducted on Sunday 10th November. The coordination of the Parade is the responsibility Fairford Town Council (FTC) supported by the Royal British Legion (RBL), Fairford Branch and St Mary's Church, Fairford. This document details the administrative coordination details for the event.
2. **Parade in General.** In outline, the Parade will comprise 5 phases:
 - a. **Phase 1 – Forming the Parade.** Those wishing to march will assemble at the Hyperion House nursing home. The Parade organisation representatives will receive a brief from the Parade Marshal on the format of the Parade. The Parade will then be formed up ready to march off . A blessing will be delivered by the Vicar prior to the Parade marching off.
 - b. **Phase 2 – Parade to the Church.** The Parade will march off from outside The Hyperion House nursing home to St Mary's Church. The Parade will halt outside of St Mary's Church and file into the church under instruction from the Parade Marshal. Standard/Banner/Flag and Wreath bearers are to congregate in the vicinity of the St Mary's Church entrance porch.
 - c. **Phase 3 – Church Service.** The Vicar will lead the Remembrance Sunday Church Service. Under direction from the Vicar and during the first hymn, Bearers will move into the Church to the High Altar. They will then 'Turn and Face' the congregation for the Act of Remembrance. During the second hymn, Standards/Banners and wreaths will be placed on, or near the High Altar. These will then be retrieved during the final hymn.
 - d. **Phase 4 – Reforming the Parade and Wreath Laying.** On completion of the Church Service, the Parade will reform on High Street facing the Fairford War Memorial. Standard/Banner/Flag and Wreath bearers are to move to allocated positions beside the Memorial and at the front of the Parade respectively. The Parade Marshal will provide the signal to commence the laying of wreaths at the base of the Memorial which will be accompanied by the hymn 'Abide with Me' sounded by the Bugler. The Parade will be at the position of 'Attention' and the Standard/Banner/ Flag will be in the 'Dipped in Honour' position for the duration of the wreath laying. The vicar will close the proceedings with prayers.
 - e. **Phase 5 – March Off and Parade Dismissal.** On completion of the laying of Standard/Banner/Flag bearers are to re-join the Parade. On the signal from the Parade Marshal, the Parade will march off to the Market Place, 'Halt' and then disperse. The Parade Marshal will offer word of thanks and appreciation to all those who took part in the parade.

7. **Parade Route.** The Parade will form up outside the Hyperion House and once organised will march down London Road and wheel right into the Market Place, up the High Street to the Church where it will halt and face the war memorial before being dismissed to enter the Church.
